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What to bring:

If you are sleeping at the cabins you will need:

bath towel, washcloth

shampoo, toiletries

snacks/beverages

bed linens (sheets and blanket or sleeping bag, pillow)

(we will reserve beds on a first-come-first-serve basis. In the event that all bunks are full, floor space is available. You we recommend that you bring an air mattress if sleeping on the floor)



If you are coming Friday, please bring:

any ensemble music you would like to read with the group

If you will be there on Saturday and/or Sunday, please bring:

your favorite breakfast/brunch food to share for Saturday and Sunday mornings

your instrument

your favorite side dish, snack, or dessert, and beverage to share at the pot-luck cookout after the play-in

swimsuit

beach towel

cooler and beverages

Mosquito spray

beach chairs/lawn chairs

a tote or wagon to carry your belongings to the beach



Info about Quintana Beach County Park

All cabins are cooled and heated; included are a television (local channels only), microwave, coffee pot, toaster, mini refrigerator, range, bathroom with shower, paper towels, toilet tissue and hand soap provided in bathrooms. Bed linens, towels and cooking utensils are NOT included.

Bagged ice is available for sale in the park office. Drink vending machine is located near the beach restrooms.

The Seaburn Cabin is located on the main boardwalk at the rear of the Seaburn Day House. A grill is available on the ground near the cabin.

This cabin has a full size refrigerator and bathtub.

The Perry pavilion is located adjacent to the playground and the Seaburn Day house. Solid roof provides shade and partial protection from rain. Seating capacity is 48.

No glass containers. \$500 fine. Pets are NOT allowed in cabins or overnight outdoors. All county buildings are non-smoking. Check in is 2 pm. Check out is 11 am. Free wireless internet for registered guests. Security gate closes at dusk. Code required for entry.

Quintana Park has a half mile of pedestrian beach. The east end of the beach ends with the Quintana jetty; the west jetty for the Freeport ship channel. The jetty is popular for fishing, bird watching or just strolling and watching the ships come in or the dolphins play. The west end of the beach features a lighted fishing pier. The pier may be accessed after dark outside of the park by vehicle. Surf fishing is allowed anywhere along the beach. Fishing license is required while fishing anywhere in the park.

Restrooms and outdoor showers are in close proximity to the beach.

The park also has a large playground, a sand volleyball court, horseshoe pits, hiking trails, picnic tables and grills. You may borrow game equipment at no charge during office hours.
